

Location and boundaries



Population and dwellings

There are a number of different ways of measuring the population of an area, all of which give an insight into the size of the place and its rate of growth over different time periods. The Census counts people where they are on the night of the Census (enumerated population) and also by where they usually live (usual residence). Both these populations are useful and form the basis for a range of characteristics collected in the Census.

However, the most accurate count of the total population is Estimated Resident Population, which factors in an estimate of those missed in the Census and those who were overseas on Census night. It is usually higher than either Census count, and is also updated annually after the Census, providing preliminary estimates for up to 5 years.

This page provides the three population counts for Killarney Heights at the last Census, with comparisons to previous Census years for the Census counts only. The current estimate for Killarney Heights at the most recent year available is shown at the top of the page. This figure is a preliminary estimate only and is subject to review after the next Census data are released. Please use with caution.

Also included are a range of sub-population groups and key statistics from the Census (usual resident) population, such as citizens, employed persons and Indigenous population.

These figures all provide the context for the size of the population and growth rate within Killarney Heights and should be looked at in conjunction with other basic demographic information, such as Age Structure, Dwelling Type and Household Size.

The data on this page are sourced from a variety of different tables and designed to give a range of population and dwelling numbers for the area.

Dominant groups

Analysis of the household/family types in Killarney Heights in 2016 compared to Greater Sydney shows that there was a higher proportion of couple families with child(ren) as well as a lower proportion of one-parent families. Overall, 54.5% of total families were couple families with child(ren), and 8.4% were one-parent families, compared with 35.3% and 10.4% respectively for Greater Sydney.

There were a lower proportion of lone person households and a higher proportion of couples without children. Overall, the proportion of lone person households was 11.6% compared to 20.4% in Greater Sydney while the proportion of couples without children was 23.6% compared to 22.4% in Greater Sydney.

Emerging groups

The number of households in Killarney Heights increased by 16 between 2011 and 2016.

There were no major differences in Killarney Heights between 2011 and 2016.



Dwelling type

Dwelling Type is an important determinant of Killarney Heights's residential role and function. A greater concentration of higher density dwellings is likely to attract more young adults and smaller households, often renting. Larger, detached or separate dwellings are more likely to attract families and prospective families. The residential built form often reflects market opportunities or planning policy, such as building denser forms of housing around public transport nodes or employment centres.

Dwelling Type statistics should be viewed in conjunction with Household Size, Household Types, Housing Tenure and Age Structure for a more complete picture of the housing market in Killarney Heights.

Dominant groups

In 2016, there were 1,384 separate houses in the area, 68 medium density dwellings, and 2 high density dwellings.

Analysis of the types of dwellings in Killarney Heights in 2016 shows that 94.7% of all dwellings were separate houses; 4.7% were medium density dwellings, and 0.2% were in high density dwellings, compared with 55.0%, 20.3%, and 23.5% in the Greater Sydney respectively.

In 2016, a total of 95.8% of the dwellings in Killarney Heights were occupied on Census night, compared to 92.5% in Greater Sydney. The proportion of unoccupied dwellings was 4.2%, which is smaller compared to that found in Greater Sydney (7.3%).

Emerging groups

The total number of dwellings in Killarney Heights increased by 32 between 2011 and 2016.

There were no major differences in Killarney Heights between 2011 and 2016.



Housing tenure

Killarney Heights's Housing Tenure data provides insights into its socio-economic status as well as the role it plays in the housing market. For example, a high concentration of private renters may indicate a transient area attractive to young singles and couples, while a concentration of home owners indicates a more settled area with mature families and empty-nesters (Household Summary). Tenure can also reflect built form (Dwelling Type), with a significantly higher share of renters in high density housing and a substantially larger proportion of homeowners in separate houses, although this is not always the case.

In conjunction with other socio-economic status indicators in Killarney Heights, Tenure data is useful for analysing housing markets, housing affordability and identifying public housing areas.

Dominant groups

Analysis of the housing tenure of households of Killarney Heights in 2016 compared to Greater Sydney shows that there was a larger proportion of households who owned their dwelling; a larger proportion purchasing their dwelling; and a smaller proportion who were renters.

Overall, 46.7% of households owned their dwelling; 41.4% were purchasing, and 9.8% were renting, compared with 27.7%, 31.5% and 32.6% respectively for Greater Sydney.

Emerging groups

The largest change in housing tenure categories for the households in Killarney Heights between 2011 and 2016 was:

• Mortgage (+56 households)

The total number of households in Killarney Heights increased by 15 between 2011 and 2016.
